Senior students, who have excelled in the program are eligible for a work study program. Students attend academic classes in the morning and work in a local shop in the afternoon. This is a voluntary program. Students on cooperative ed. are required to provide their own tools and work clothes.

Course Description

The Automotive Technology Program is designed to provide students, the opportunity to explore and learn skills, needed for a career in the automotive field. The students will attend class for three periods per day, for three years, beginning in the tenth grade. Our goal is to provide the student with entry level skills, needed to work in an auto service facility.



Our facility is located in the vocational wing of the DV High School in Milford. We can accommodate up to ten vehicles in our shop. The shop itself has state of the art equipment for the students to use during their learning experience. Equipment includes electronic alignment, electronic wheel balancing, ignition scopes, hand held lab scopes, computerized scan tools, rim clamp tire mounting equipment and many other pieces of equipment that will assist the students in their career path.

Students who excel in the program are eligible for placement, during their senior year, through the schools cooperative education program.

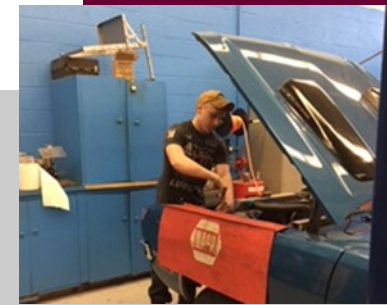
Topics:

Each topic will be covered in a classroom setting through the use of diagrams, handouts, textbook assignments, shop manuals and detailed lecture and demonstrations. Students will have two research topics per year, based on current industry trends. One shall be a descriptive essay and the second a comparative essay.

Time shall be divided between classroom and shop activities. (About 30% classroom & 70% shop activities.) Shop activities shall supplement and reinforce the classroom activities.
