Dear Parents/Guardians:

Happy New Year to all of you! May 2021 bring you good health and plenty of happiness. Our schools were closed for 12 days for winter recess so I wanted to give you an update on the COVID-19 situation over that time period. We had 20 cases over the 12 days so that's less than two per day. The case breakdown is as follows:

DDPS - 2	DDES - 3	DVES - 3	SES - 1
DVMS - 3	DDMS - 1	DVHS - 7	

I do anticipate some short-term closures over the next few months. If a school hits a certain threshold of positive cases in a 14-day period (which varies based on school size), we will switch that school to remote learning for one or more days as per state regulations. These short-term switches to remote learning allow for case investigation, contact tracing and disinfecting. It also resets the 14-day count back to zero for any school that goes remote for one or more days. The 20 cases listed above all happened while we were closed for winter recess so all of our schools reopened today with new 14-day counts starting at zero. Thankfully, the quarantine periods for almost all of the 20 cases ended in time for the staff and students affected to return to school today.

As I was typing this letter, we were just informed of our first new case since reopening this morning. This case is from Delaware Valley Middle School so their 14-day count just went from zero to one. No one needs to be quarantined as the student hasn't been in school since December.

The virus is definitely more prevalent in the community now than it was just a few weeks ago. We are asking everyone to keep their guard up and limit their exposure as much as possible. **What happens in our community seeps into our schools so we need everyone's help to keep the schools open.**

Finally, we are going to stop making the automated calls and social media posts every time we have a positive case. Since we are now held to new metrics based on a rolling 14-day count, we will make the calls/social media posts each time a school is forced to go remote. We will still post letters on our website each day that we have positive cases. We will also continue to update the coronavirus dashboard weekly on our website.

The Delaware Valley School District was notified of two confirmed cases of coronavirus (COVID-19) at the Delaware Valley Elementary School and the Shohola Elementary School. The DVES individual was last in school on Friday, December 18, 2020, and the SES individual was last in school on January 5, 2021. The classrooms and spaces used by the individuals have been cleaned and disinfected since then according to CDC guidelines. The schools will remain open. No one needs to be quarantined in either situation.

In addition, the Department of Health notified us of two more cases that occurred over winter recess. This increases the total over vacation to 22 cases.

Dear Parent/Guardian:

The Delaware Valley School District was notified today of six confirmed cases of coronavirus COVID-19 as follows:

SES - 1 DVES - 1 DDMS - 1 DVHS - 3

None of these six individuals have been in school since December so no one needs to be quarantined except those from their own households. We continue to clean and disinfect the schools on a daily basis. All schools will remain open.

We also received clarification from the state on tracking case counts. The state's language says "the case count for a school building would include any individual (student or staff) with a confirmed or probable case of COVID-19 **who was physically present** in the school setting while infectious, including but not limited to instruction, work, sports or extracurricular activities."

Of all the cases reported to us this week, only one case involved someone who was physically here this week. Therefore, that means when tracking the 14-day counts per building, *Shohola Elementary is at one case and all the other schools are at zero.* I apologize for the confusion previously but this is certainly good news. It also makes sense in that if the goal is to control the spread then only those who are physically present while infectious should be counted toward a possible short-term closure.

I can't say thank you enough for the efforts of our staff, students and parents/guardians. While we hear stories of people trying to skirt the system, 99% of you are doing a wonderful job trying to keep our kids safe and our schools open.

Dear Parent/Guardian:

The Delaware Valley School District was notified today of seven confirmed cases of coronavirus COVID-19 as follows:

DDPS - 1 DDMS - 2 DVHS - 4

We are now at 68 cases total since the start of the school year. All of our schools except the high school have a threshold of two cases in a rolling 14-day time period to cause a short-term shutdown while the high school has a threshold of six cases. These thresholds were set jointly by the state departments of health and education.

Since Dingman-Delaware Middle School (DDMS) had two cases today, it will be 100% remote on Monday. This means all DDMS students will stay home and learn remotely using their Chromebooks and Schoology. The staff will report to work as usual on Monday. The in-person students can physically return to the school on Tuesday.

Again, this is DDMS only! All other schools are operating on their regular schedule.

The **grab and go lunch pick-up** on the DD campus on Monday from 9:30-10:30 will still happen like usual. This is open to all families.

The Delaware Valley School District was notified today of four confirmed cases of coronavirus COVID-19 as follows:

SES – 2 (one case hasn't been in school since December so it doesn't count toward 14-day count)

DVHS – 3 (one case is a Zoom student so it doesn't count toward the 14-day count)

Since Shohola Elementary School and the High School reached their thresholds today, both schools will be 100% remote on Tuesday. This means all SES and DVHS students will stay home and learn remotely using their Chromebooks and Schoology. The staff will report to work as usual on Tuesday. The students can physically return to the school on Wednesday.
