Dear Parent/Guardian,

The Delaware Valley School District was notified of five new case of coronavirus (COVID-19) at the Delaware Valley High School and one new case at the Shohola Elementary School. The classrooms and spaces used by the individuals have been cleaned and disinfected according to CDC guidelines. All close contacts have been notified.

Since Shohola Elementary School has reached their threshold today, they will be 100% remote for the next three days (March 2, 3, and 4). This means all SES students will stay home and learn remotely using their Chromebooks and Schoology. The students can physically return to the school on Friday.

This is for SES only! All other schools are operating on their regular schedule.

Parents/Guardians, students, and staff are encouraged to do the following to help prevent the spread of illness at home and in school:

- Avoid close contact with people who are sick and/or have tested positive
- Wash your hands frequently
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth
- Stay home when you are sick or come in close contact with someone who has tested positive
- Cover your mouth and nose with the inside of your elbow when you cough and sneeze
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces
- Practice social distancing and wear a mask

Please keep your child home if they are experiencing any of the following signs or symptoms: fever (100.4 F or greater), cough, shortness of breath, difficulty breathing, nausea or vomiting, diarrhea, lack of smell or taste, sore throat, chills, muscle pain, headache, congestion, or runny nose.

The Delaware Valley School District will continue to monitor the situation and will provide updates as needed. Please know the health and safety of our students and staff is our utmost priority.
