

130. HOMEWORK - Pg. 2

Each student shall be responsible for completing homework assignments as directed.

Elementary (Grades K-5) and (Grades K-6)

Homework time on a given day should not exceed a half an hour in primary grades, and one (1) hour in upper grades. The following times are given as guides, some students may require a little more, some a little less:

10 minutes - Kindergarten	30 minutes - Grade 3
10 minutes - Grade 1	40 minutes - Grade 4
20 minutes - Grade 2	50 minutes - Grade 5

In addition to homework, every child is expected to read thirty (30) minutes at home each night.

Summer reading lists will be provided at each grade level and are available on the district website. The student's first quarter grade will be enhanced by completion of the reading and follow-up assignments. This enhancement is not to exceed five (5) points on the student's first quarter grade average.

Middle School (Grades 6-8)

Homework time should be one (1) hour to one (1) hour forty-five (45) minutes per night. This may vary slightly day to day since students have multiple teachers. Homework is for promotion and reinforcement of skills taught on a day-to-day basis.

Homework will be assigned in all core subjects. In addition to homework, students will also have the responsibility to study for quizzes, tests, complete reading assignments and complete research projects. These timelines will vary from day to day, week-to-week, etc., and probably will require more homework time. Students should be encouraged to utilize weekends, half days, snow days, vacations and evenings to help them complete their responsibilities and meet all deadlines.

Summer reading lists will be provided at each grade level and are available on the district website. The student's first quarter grade will be enhanced by completion of the reading and follow-up assignments. This enhancement is not to exceed five (5) points on the student's first quarter grade average.

High School (Grades 9-12)

Homework time should be one (1) hour thirty (30) minutes to two (2) hours per night. This may vary slightly day to day since students have multiple teachers. Homework is for promotion and reinforcement of skills taught on a day-to-day basis.

Homework will be assigned in all core subjects. In addition to homework, students will also have the responsibility to study for quizzes, tests, complete reading assignments and complete research projects. These timelines will vary from day to day, week-to-week, etc., and probably will require more homework time. Students should be encouraged to utilize weekends, half days, snow days, vacations and evenings to help them complete their responsibilities and meet all deadlines.

Summer reading lists will be provided at each grade level and are available on the district website.

An incentive program will be implemented and shared with the high school students.

Certain secondary interdisciplinary, advanced, and advanced placement courses have mandatory summer reading that will be assigned by the teacher.
