Delaware Valley's senior quarterback completed 15 of 26 passes for 315 yards and three touchdowns in the second-ranked Warriors' 37-35 victory over Parkland on Friday. Schor led the Warriors on a game-winning, 67-yard drive late in the fourth quarter by completing four passes and finding running back Joe Santiago for the go-ahead touchdown with 24 seconds remaining. Schor also became only the 11th area quarterback to surpass 4,000 yards in the game, and ranks ninth on the all-time passing yards list (4,248).

Trying to stay calm for the rest of the team because everyone was kind of looking kind of flat on the sideline, so I'm going up and down, pumping everybody up, letting them know that's it's not going to be over. ... When they scored their go-ahead touchdown, that's when I turned around and everybody was just looking at each other, like "Oh no, we just lost the game." So I went up and down the sideline, I was yelling at the guys, "I don't know why everybody's acting so flat — we're going to drive the field right now, we're going to go score a touchdown." I'm not sure if I believed it 100 percent, but I thought in the back of my mind, we run these things all the time in practice, so we can definitely do it one more time.

How much is the situation amplified with it being the first game of the year, home opener? It's definitely amped up. We knew that this was going to be a huge test and we'd never beat a Lehigh Valley team. We knew Parkland was going to be a big test for us.

How did it feel when you saw Santiago cross the goal line for the winning touchdown? It was great. He crossed it, and I was so excited. I tried to run to him but everybody beat me to him.
