TODAY IN HISTORY

In 1968, the first manned Apollo mission, Apollo 7, was launched on a Saturn 1-B rocket from Cape Kennedy. The astronauts onboard were the Captain <u>Wally Schirra, Jr.</u> (Navy), with crew members Donn Fulton Eisele (Air Force) and <u>R. Walter Cunningham</u> (civilian). They circled for 11 days, up to 183 miles above the Earth, in 90 minute orbits.
