- On Friday, October 6th, the music department was treated to a Kindred Spirits performance by Publiquartet. The string group entertained our students with a beautiful and informative presentation, and then held a question and answer session with the students. The music department just finished its first fundraiser, which successfully raised almost \$10,000 for the annual Music in the Parks competition in June. The band, chorus, and orchestra are currently working hard in preparation for upcoming events such as our radio performance on WSUS 102.3, Akenac Park's Christmas Festival, Christmas caroling through Milford, and most importantly our winter concerts!'
